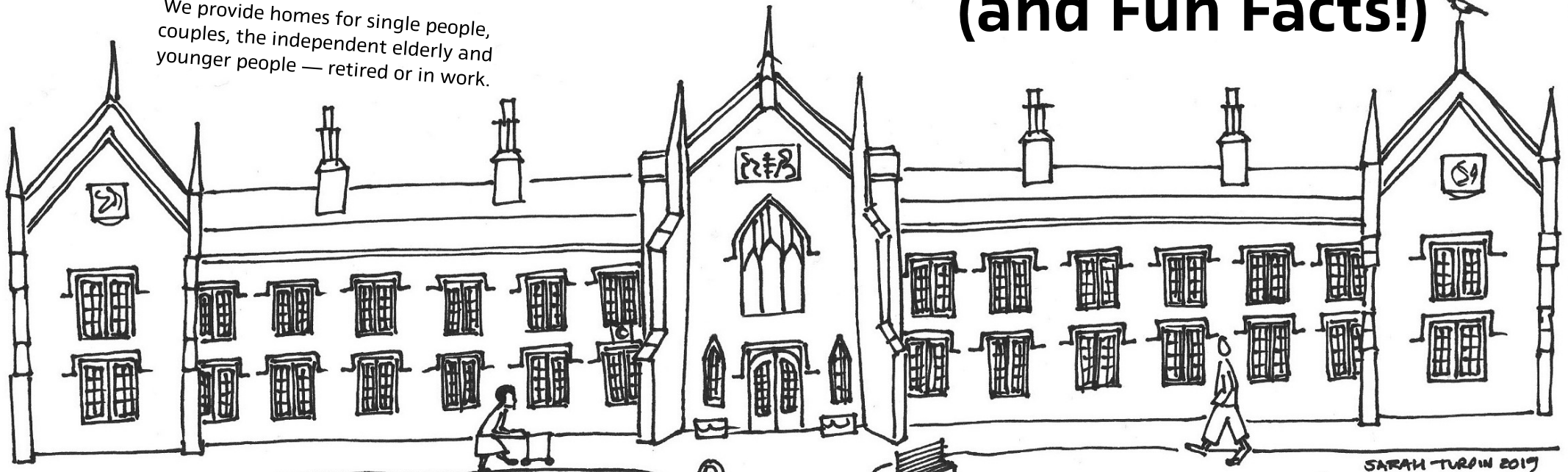


King Edward VI Almshouses Colouring Competition (and Fun Facts!)

We provide homes for single people, couples, the independent elderly and younger people — retired or in work.



As well as this building, and three others in Abbey Lane, we house people in Prime's Close, Park Lane and in Freshwell Street.

In 2014 we won a prestigious HRH The Prince of Wales Patron's Award for our renovation and conversion of the Freshwell Street property to four modern self-contained flats, two for residents with restricted mobility.

King Edward VI Almshouses is a registered charity run by 11 local voluntary Trustee/Directors, with the assistance of two paid Officers.

Our Almshouses in Saffron Walden were founded in 1400. The current building seen here was built in 1834 at a cost of £5000!

We once owned a 16th-century Mazer Bowl which Samuel Pepys drunk from in 1666, when stopping at the Almshouses after a visit to Audley End House. He recorded the visit and the bowl in his famous diaries. The Mazer Bowl was sold in 1929 to fund roof repairs but a replica can be seen in our Museum.
